In 1990, Uday Bhawalkar’s international career began and subsequently, he has presented many solo concerts in Europe, USA, Canada and Mexico.

He has performed in world music festivals in Europe including England (WOMAD) and Belgium (SFINKS). Uday has collaborated with artists from other disciplines and cultures including the contemporary dancer Astad Deboo, Ensemble Modern in Germany and professional musicians from Spain and USA. Universities in Europe and USA have hosted his workshops. Additionally, he has contributed to the soundtracks of International Art films including Mani Kaul’s Cloud Door, Aparna Sen’s Mr & Mrs Iyer and Amol Palekar’s Anahat. Several recordings of Uday Bhawalkar’s Dhrupad performances are available on CD in India and abroad.

Born in Maharashtra, Manik Munde trained under Guru-Shishya Parampara from-“Bhakta Ganesh Anna Chaudhari (ParaliVaijanath M.H.); Pt. Satish Chandra Chaudhari; Mridangacharya Late Pandit Mahant Amarnath Mishra; Pt. Govindrao Deshmukh.

He has been to the United States several times accompanying leading Dhrupad artists. In addition, he has solo albums to his credit. He is a highly regarded accompanist at the Major Music Festivals of India.
